

#### Specimen notes

In the Reserve Bank of New Zealand produced one hundred specimen notes with the serial number AMJ 000000. The two small repetitions of the word 'SPECIMEN', near the serial numbers on the front of the note, are printed horizontally. The larger repetition of 'SPECIMEN' over the denomination in the centre of the note is falling on a 25° angle, as is the single occurrence of the overprint on the back of the note. All overprints are in red.

#### Miscellaneous

- ! Standard Catalog of World Paper Money number 169c.
- Intersection of New Zealand reserved the first one thousand notes with serial numbers AMJ 000001 to AMJ 001000 for sale in matched serial number sets. (Refer to page 101 for further details.)
- Intree hundred notes numbered AMR 000001 to AMR 000300 were issued at the New Zealand Numismatic Convention, held on 18 May 1990. Accompanying the issue was a card signed by the Reserve Bank's Governor, D. T. Brash. These notes were sanctioned by the Reserve Bank and were sold at \$10.00 each. (Refer to page 103 for further details.)
- In December 1990, the Reserve Bank of New Zealand issued ten thousand packs consisting of 1- and 2-dollar notes and 1- and 2-dollar coins. The packs were issued at \$20.00 each. The 1-dollar notes in the packs carried serial numbers ranging from ANS 989001 to ANS 999000. (Refer to page 105 for further details.)
- In June 1991, the Reserve Bank of New Zealand issued a special set of 1- and 2-dollar notes called 'Final Impressions'. Sealed in a perspex frame and accompanied by a numbered certificate, each set cost \$50.00. The serial numbers for the 1-dollar notes ranged between ANS 950001 and ANS 989000, with the 1- and 2-dollar notes having matching serial numbers. Many packs proved faulty, with notes moving inside the two sheets of perspex. (Refer to page 106 for further details.)
- I Two hundred notes with serial numbers AMS 976001 to AMS 976100 and AMS 976501 to AMS 976600 were unofficially issued with an overprint by the Wellington Coin Club in September 1991. (Refer to page 106 for further details.)
- ! The Reserve Bank ceased issuing the 1-dollar note in February 1991.
- ! The 1-dollar note was demonetized from the close of business on 16 April 1993. Although no longer legal tender, they remain redeemable at the Reserve Bank for the foreseeable future.
- Two hundred notes with serial numbers ANB 261001 to ANB 261200 were released with an unofficial overprint by the Wellington Coin Club in December 1999. (Refer to page 107.)
